

## **Keltys Children's Ministry WELL CHILD POLICY**

Keltys First Baptist Church desires to provide a healthy environment for your child – not only spiritually, but also physically.

With this goal in mind, we have adopted the following health care practices. Parents will be asked to keep their children from church activities if any of the following conditions exist:

- Fever within the last 24 hours
- Discolored (not clear) nasal discharge
- Unusual lethargy, irritability, persistent crying, difficulty breathing or other signs of possible severe illness
- Strep throat, until 24 hours after treatment has been initiated, and until the child has been free of fever for 24 hours
- Diarrhea that is not contained by diapers
- Vomiting within in the previous 24 hours.
- Mouth sores associated with an inability of the child to control his saliva
- Chicken pox, until the sixth day after the onset of rash or sooner only if all lesions have dried and crusted
- Pink eye with white or yellow discharge, often with matted eyelids after sleep and eye pain or redness of the eyelids or skin surrounding the eye, until 24 hours after treatment has been initiated
- Mumps, until nine days after onset of parotid gland swelling
- Head lice
- Any open skin sore until 24 hours after treatment has been initiated
- Persistent, uncontrollable biting
- If a child is being treated with antibiotics, he/she should be on the drug for 24 hours prior to attending nursery. Parents, please let a nursery director know if a child has a continually clear runny nose or rash due to non-contagious allergies.

Unless your child is allergic to disposable diapers or training pants, please let him wear them while he is at church.
