



## WOMEN MENTORING WOMEN OUTLINE

You should meet for discipleship each week. Each meeting should last 45 - 60 mins.

Remember this is an outline and if you need to spend more time on a particular subject that's okay.

#### Week 1:

Meet together for the purpose of getting to know one another; introduce yourselves, share contact information, and share pray request. Let her know that next week you will share your salvation testimony and would like for her to share as well. Pray together before leaving.

#### Week 2:

Share with the woman you are discipling how you came to know Christ as your Savior, and then ask her to share her testimony. You will evaluate her testimony to determine if she is indeed a believer. If the person you are discipling is uncertain of their salvation, then your goal should be evangelism. If she has a salvation testimony, ask if she can equipped to share the gospel with others. If she can, have her share with you. If not, then you will need teach her how using the hand or bridge illustration.

#### Week 3:

Practice the gospel outline. Pray together. Ask her to read the entire book of Titus before your next meeting.

#### Week 4:

Continue practicing the gospel presentation. Discuss Titus 2 Week 4 Handout

#### Week 5:

Discuss Titus 2 Week 5 Handout. Chose a passage of scripture to memorize together. Practice each week as you meet until verses or passage is completely memorized.



Titus is a letter from Paul to Titus. Some things Titus has been instructed to do:

- 1. Put things in order (v. 1:5)
- 2. Appoint elders in every town (v.1:5)
- 3. Teach what accords with sound doctrine (v.2:1)

- a. Thoughts and actions are to be pure Matt. 15:18-19 Phil. 4:8
- b. Make no provision for the flesh Romans 13:12-14
- c. As much as possible, protect yourself from being defiled Titus 1:15 (examples: Facebook, movies, TV, etc.)

- 5. She is submissive, kind, pure, etc. whether she feels like it or not. Heb.12
