Biblical History

- "In the course of time Cain brought to the Lord an offering of the fruit of the ground, and Abel also brought of the firstborn of his flock and of their fat portions. And the Lord had regard for Abel and his offering, but for Cain and his offering he had no regard. So Cain was very angry, and his face fell. The Lord said to Cain, "Why are you angry, and why has your face fallen? If you do well, will you not be accepted? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door. Its desire is for you, but you must rule over it." (Genesis 4:3-7, ESV)
- "Then Noah built an altar to the Lord and took some of every clean animal and some of every clean bird and offered burnt offerings on the altar." (**Genesis 8:20**, ESV)
- "Then the Lord appeared to Abram and said, "To your offspring I will give this land." So he built there an altar to the Lord, who had appeared to him." (**Genesis 12:7**, ESV)

Proverbs 12:1 Whoever loves discipline loves knowledge, but he who hates reproof is **stupid**.

We'll consider 3 aspects of discipline:

1. THE HEART OF DISCIPLINE

- A. The Scriptures are clear about the <u>centrality</u> of the heart.
 - 1) Greek term: KARDIA
 - 2) The heart is the **center** of the inner life of man and the **source** (or seat) of all the forces and functions of soul and spirit:
 - a) In the heart dwell feelings and emotions, **desires** and passions.
 - b) The heart is the seat of understanding, the source of **thought**, reflection and resolve.
 - c) Thus the heart is supremely the one **center** in man to which God turns, in which the religious life is rooted, which determines moral conduct. (Taken from Theological Dictionary of the New Testament)
 - 3) Biblical Examples:
 - a) "Keep your heart with all vigilance, for **from it** flow the springs of life." (Proverbs 4:23)
 - b) "But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him. For the Lord sees not as man sees: man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart."" (1 Samuel 16:7)
 - c) "For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery." (Mark 7:21; cf. Matthew 12:34)
 - d) "The good person out of the good treasure of his heart produces good, and the evil person out of his evil treasure produces evil, for out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks." (Luke 6:45)
 - e) "As in water face reflects face, so the heart of man reflects the man." (Proverbs 27:19)

 - c) "The Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that <u>every</u> intention of the thoughts of his ______ was _____ evil continually." (Genesis 6:5)

2) Keltys FBC Doctrinal Statement on Depravity

Although man was created in the image of God (Genesis 1:26: 2:17) he fell through sin and that image was **marred** (Romans 5:12; James 3:9). In his unregenerate state, he is void of spiritual life, is under the influence of the devil, and lacks any power to save himself (Ephesians 2:1-3; John 1:13). The sin nature has been transmitted to every member of the human race, the man Jesus Christ alone being excepted (Romans 3:23; I Peter 2:22). Because of the sin nature, man possesses no divine life and is essentially and unchangeably **depraved** apart from divine grace (Romans 3:10-19; Jeremiah 17:9).

Knowing now the centrality of the heart, the condition of the heart, and the cure for the heart; we understand why Tedd Tripp says this:

Christ didn't sacrifice His life on the cross because people need a superficial behavioral change, he died because people need a ______ ____ _____ !

"And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh." (Ezekiel 36:26; cf. 11:19; 18:31)

When we attempt to raise our children, correcting only their outward behavior without addressing the sins and idolatries of the heart, we are only raising good, little, legalistic Pharisees who will one day aside from the grace of God – be condemned to Hell for an ______ religion that affected no change to their hearts.

This, I'm afraid, is the typical method of child-raising,

and the cause of most teenage rebellion -

that is, ______ without REASONS

or DISCIPLINE without ______ .

So, the HEART of the matter is the HEART! We want to go beyond behavior to the heart.

4. THE HELP FOR DISCIPLINE

There are two ______ by which we address heart issues in children. Think of them as two sides of the same coin. They are equally important:

"The ______ and ______ give wisdom, but a child left to himself brings shame to his mother... Discipline your son and he will give you rest; he will give delight to your heart." **Proverbs 29:15,17**

- 1) Notice the weaving of physical discipline with the heart issues in Proverbs 23:13-26.
- As we begin the never-ending task of shepherding our child's heart, we must travel both directions. We must use both methods. The rod was never intended to be used without reproof.

4) What we've seen in the last 50 years or so is a total ______ from one unbiblical extreme to another. Years ago, fathers jerked their children up by the scruff of the neck, carried them behind the "woodshed" and "wore them out." No ______, all pain. Today, we see just the opposite. All talk, no pain. Parents talk themselves blue in the face



without imposing any physical, painful discipline on their children.

5) Punishment vs. Discipline

The biblical concept of the rod is not the parent exacting _______ for the child's wrong. It is not payment due. Many parents have a punitive mindset. They see the discipline as the child paying for his sins. Rather than correction having the positive goal of ______ it has the negative goal of ______. (Shepherding a Child's Heart, Tedd Tripp, p. 107-108)

God punishes the wicked and there is no room for repentance. But God chastens His children. While punishment and discipline may at times take the same ______, yet the purpose is vitally different. There is grief, pain and sorrow both in punishment and in discipline. The difference is that in punishment there is no ______, but in chastening the whole purpose is _______. That is important for us to realize. (Withhold Not Correction, Bruce A. Ray, p. 74)
