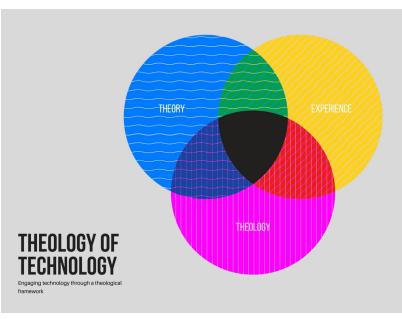

And it hence also appears how immense is the value of eternal glory, that it can excite and draw all things to desire it. ⁷
